FAITH

What does it mean to have faith?

In American English, to say “I believe” usually means to affirm that the statement “God exists” is a true statement.

I have trouble with this understanding of faith.

First of all, the mere existence of God makes very little difference in our life. It might be comforting to know that there is a God, but it doesn't change things much.

Secondly, we have no way to confirm whether we really believe what we are saying. I have met people who claim that they do not believe in God, but when they talk to me about their life and when I observe their behavior I come to the conclusion that they do believe in God, regardless of their denial. Sad to say, I have also known people who claim to believe in God whose actions seem to belie that affirmation.

Biblical law has a greater punishment for the burglar by night than for the burglar by day. There is an obvious practical rationale for this distinction, which is that the burglar by day does not expect to run into anyone in the home, while the burglar at night is prepared to do violence if the residents of the home wake up and find him there. But there is another explanation, which is that the burglar by day has no respect for God or humankind, while the burglar by night fears being seen by people but has no fear of being seen by God. In other words, the true mark of faith is how one behaves when we think no one is watching. Are you concerned that God sees?

The greatest difficulty with affirming God's existence is that God's justice is not apparent in the world as we experience it. Good people may die young. Wrongdoers prosper and take advantage of those who are trusting and good. How can one say that one believes in God in the face of such injustice?

The Jewish scholar Louis Jacobs defines “emunah” - faith - as the belief that despite the many injustices of the world, a life of integrity and obedience to God's law is ultimately rewarded in its own way. The fool believes that everything is happening as it should. The wise person of faith believes that you will never go wrong doing what is right, regardless of the outcome in real life experience. True faith is expressed as integrity.

I do not really know how to say “goodbye” after my year as your interim rabbi in Jackson. I feel so honored that you have called me your rabbi. I feel good knowing that I am leaving you in the capable hands of Rabbi Jeffrey Kurtz-Lendner. I cannot truly say goodbye because I know that a piece of my heart will always be here, and with God's help I will return to visit. I think my final word in this bulletin should be to thank those many people in Beth Israel Congregation who serve God, the Jewish people, and the community with integrity. Bless you!
